




### FALL TOTAL HEADCOUNT




### FALL CONTINUING STUDENT HEADCOUNT






### **FALL NEW FIRST TIME HEADCOUNT**







### FY 2024 FINANCIAL HIGHLIGHTS

- Tuition revenue \$645,000 more than budgeted – 5% increase
- Increase in auxiliary revenues of 6%
  - Residence hall revenue up 9%
  - Dining revenue up 17%
- Pay plan implementation Greater of 4% or \$1.50/hour
- Investment earnings are up by \$200,000
- Revolving reserve account remains whole





### **BUDGET PLANNING FOR FY 2025**

- FY 25 Funding
  - Increase in State funding of \$1M for FY 25
  - One time only funding such as Montana Ten still to be determined
- Budget Department working in concert with Institutional Research to estimate enrollment to estimate tuition revenue
- 10.08 FTE positions were approved by Executive Budget Committee
  - 8.08 FTE added to state budget
  - 2 FTE added to auxiliaries
  - "Possibilities" funding resolved by current unrestricted or auxiliaries funds
- Pay plan 4% increase or \$1.50 per hour whichever is greater
- Budget finalized by end of June, Board of Regents approves in September

### FY25 PERFORMANCE FUNDING

- FY 25 Highlands qualifies for \$199,056 out of a possible \$199,056 = 100%
- FY 25 Montana Tech qualifies for \$771,603 out of \$914,559 = 84%
- FY 25 Highlands and Tech combined qualify for \$970,659 out of \$1,133,615 = 86%





# LONG RANGE BUILDING PROGRAM FUNDING FY 2024-2025

Capital Development Projects Funding - \$38M

- Main Hall Remodel and Renovations \$30M
- Engineering Hall Renovations \$8M

Major Repair Projects - \$2.305M

- Electrical Distribution Multiple Buildings \$650,000
- Restroom Renovations Multiple Buildings \$1,200,000
- Exterior Repairs Multiple Buildings \$455,000

Supplemental Funding

Steam Heating Tunnels and Lines - \$2.75M

Total Montana Tech LRBP State Funded Projects - \$43.055M



# LONG RANGE BUILDING PROGRAM TIMELINE

- Request for Qualifications for Architect released March 2024
- Interviews and selection of architect (first week of June 2024)
- Prioritization of projects, programming, planning and design (July 2024-December 2024)
- Request for Qualifications for General Contractor/Construction Manager (October 2024)
- Interviews and selection of GCCM (December 2024)
- Architect and GCCM work together determining project priorities
- Construction start on Main Hall or Engineering Hall (likely summer of 2026)
- Smaller projects restroom renovations, exterior repairs etc. could be earlier



### **CAMPUS IMPACTS**


- Project Impacts to campus
  - Determination of swing space
  - Emptying of buildings slated for renovation
  - Classroom scheduling
  - Access on campus/traffic flow
- Construction Projects Summers of 2024 and 2025
  - Starting May 6, 2024: Heating System Upgrade Phase 3
    - Park Street closed from Marcus Daly statue to west corner of Sub
    - Curb cutting on Granite Street for access to Prospector Hall parking lot
    - Signage, fencing etc. will be placed
  - Summer 2025: Heating System upgrade Phase 3.1












### Total Fundraising w/o Major Gift in Kind






