

## Montana Tech Policy on Graduate Student Tuition

January 28, 2011

### Authority

The MUS BOR, in action taken on November 18, 2011, modified its policy statement on tuition for out of state graduate students *as follows*:

### **SUBJECT: FINANCIAL AFFAIRS Policy 940.31 – Policy Statement on Tuition**

A. Tuition levels will bear a relationship to the costs incurred by the campus in providing the education to the student. Tuition levels for resident students will bear a relation to the cost of education and the level of state support. Campuses have the flexibility to set non-resident tuition at 150% of resident tuition and set non-resident tuition for graduate research and teaching assistants at 100% of resident tuition.

### Montana Tech Policy

Montana Tech has chosen to implement the flexibility offered in this BOR policy statement. The campus will set tuition for campus employed GRA and GTA out-of-state graduate students at in-state tuition levels, as per the following guidelines:

- The policy applies only to new Graduate Students receiving GTA or GRA support of at least \$4,000 per semester.
- The policy is limited to 4 semesters for Masters Degree students.

The policy will be implemented for the Fall Semester, 2011.
