MONTANA TECH RECEIVES HISTORIC GIFT FROM DAVE AND SHERRY LESAR

Montana Technological University announced today the most significant gift in the history of the university. Excitement filled the room of faculty, staff, students, friends, and community members when Chancellor Les Cook announced a \$7M gift from Dave and Sherry Lesar. With approval from the Montana Board of Regents, the gift will be used to name the Nursing Department, the Sherry Lesar School of Nursing.

The donation will grow and sustain the nursing program's quality and impact the students, faculty and curriculum. Funds from the endowed gift will be used to provide student scholarships, professional development opportunities for faculty, leadership training, and advanced degrees including a plan to offer a master's degree in nursing education in the next five to seven years. The donation from the Lesars will also support the operation of the Lesar Family Nursing Simulation Center on campus.

CYBERSECURITY AWARENESS MONTH



DO YOUR PART TO KEEP MONTANA TECH'S DATA SECURE

Data breaches do not typically happen when a cybercriminal has hacked into an organization's infrastructure. Most Ransomware attacks are initiated by a phishing email. Don't be that person. Be wary of unusual sources, do not click on unknown links, and delete suspicious messages immediately.

Keep tabs on your apps. Your mobile device could be filled with suspicious apps running in the background or using default permissions you never realized you approved—gathering your personal information without your knowledge while also putting your identity and privacy at risk. Check your app permissions and use the "rule of least privilege" to delete what you don't need or no longer use. Learn to say "no" to privilege requests that don't make sense—only download apps from trusted vendors and sources.
