RESPONSIBLE CONDUCT OF RESEARCH TRAINING (RCR)

All Montana Tech employees and students engaged in research activities must attend RCR training every 3 years. RCR training is now offered online via CITI Programs. Please email grants@mtech.edu for detailed instructions to set up a new user account.

TESTING

The Academic Center for Excellence (ACE) offers a testing center for accommodated and makeup exams and placement tests. Our operating hours are Monday-Friday from 9:00 am to 5:00 pm. If you would like to schedule a student to take an exam at ACE, please fill out the Test Request Form at least 3 days in advance. For faculty who have used the Test Request Form before, use this new link instead of the old one, which is no longer accessible.

SERVICE ANIMALS

A reminder to all faculty and staff that a service animal (dog or miniature horse) is allowed anywhere on campus, including labs, common spaces, and the residence halls, so long as it is with the student who owns it, and the area is not dangerous to the animal. Faculty and staff may only ask students with service animals two questions:

- 1. Is the dog a service animal required because of a disability?
- 2. What work or task has the dog been trained to perform?

The only time a service animal may be removed from an area is if it is causing major disruptions (ex. destroying property, uncontrollable behavior) or posing a direct threat of physical harm. Faculty and staff may not request the student present documentation for the animal, nor ask the student to have the animal perform the work or tasks it has been trained to do. Services animals are different from assistance/emotional support animals. It is ILLEGAL in the state of Montana for someone to pretend their assistance animal is a service animal.
